**Process for Manuscript Submission.** Manuscripts intended for publications should be submitted by electronic mail in PostScript to tosem@elet.polimi.it, together with a separate abstract of the paper in ascii form. Paper submissions in five double-spaced copies, to the Editor-in-Chief, are also acceptable. In both cases a submittal letter should be sent to the Editor-in-Chief. It must contain full contact information of the lead author, with a statement, signed by him/her, that the material contained in the submitted paper has not been previously published and is not currently under consideration for publication elsewhere. If the submission is an extended, polished version of a conference paper the lead author should identify the conference and specify the differences between the submission and the conference version. Papers will be refereed in the manner customary with scientific journals before being accepted for publication. Authors should keep editors informed of changes of address.
